


Example answer: Nigeria has the fastest growing economy in the world, so it attracts many migrants from the poorer parts of Africa. At the same time, many migrants move away from Nigeria to Europe, especially the UK, as the former colonial power. Some of these migrants enter the UK illegally, but many provide skilled labour in, for example, the NHS. Nigeria is a major exporter of oil and a member of OPEC. Its main advantage for the rest of the world is the quality of its oil, as it is low in sulphur. The money earnt from exporting oil has led to the growth of the manufacturing sector with products like cars, which are exported all over the world. With English as the main language and the growth of the internet and undersea communication network, Nigeria has a fast-growing industry in telesales and call centres. Nigeria has the 3rd largest film industry in the world, after Bollywood and Hollywood. Nigeria has for a long time provided peace-keeping forces to the UN and the African Union. Soldiers have been sent to areas of conflict in Africa, Cyprus and other regions of the world. Politically Nigeria is part of the African Union and several regional groups of countries, such as the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), whose HQ is in Abuja in Nigeria. In addition, Nigeria has worldwide links with its membership of the Commonwealth.
