

3	Advantage: The program can be compiled and run to test whether it works, but the OCR Exam Reference Language is theoretical so cannot run. Disadvantage: Not everyone understands Java, but programmers of other languages are likely to understand the OCR Exam Reference Language.	1 mark for a correct advantage and 1 mark for a correct disadvantage. Other correct answers are also acceptable. This question requires an advantage and a disadvantage of Java against the OCR Exam Reference Language, so it is important that the answer clearly represents how one compares to the other.	1	AO1 2.1.2
