

Assess	Weigh up whether a statement is true.
Calculate	Mathematically work out the value of something
Compare	Describe the similarities and differences between two or more things.
Define	State or describe exactly the meaning of a word, phrase or idea.
Describe	Set out the characteristics of something.
Discuss	Bring forward the important points of or set out both sides of an argument/issue/element of content, for an against.
Evaluate	Give your verdict after providing evidence which both agrees with and contradicts an argument.
Examine	Look in close detail and establish the key facts and important issues.
Explain	Set out the causes of something and/or the factors which influence it.
Identify	Name an example, sometimes from a map, photo or graph.

Justify

Give valid reasons and evidence to support your answer.

Make a prediction

Look at evidence provided to make a judgement about the future.

Outline

A brief written description/account of something.

Propose

To suggest a course of action or intention.

State

Provide a specific piece of information (e.g. name or value) without explanation.

Suggest

Offer an opinion for a particular course of action on an event or issue/ give an explanation for something when you can't be sure.

To what extent do you agree

How much do you agree with a statement based on the evidence in argument.
